Fr Tony Writes



This weekend we celebrate Corpus Christi. The title of the feast means, of course, the Body of Christ. We celebrate the amazing truth that Jesus Christ comes to us intimately in the form of bread and wine. In fact the full title of the feast is, The Body and Blood of

Christ. There used to be a separate feast of the Blood of Christ, but the two were combined when the liturgy was revised after the Second Vatican Council.

Until the pandemic we had the opportunity to receive Communion 'under both kinds'. As "Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds" (GIRM n. 281). So far it has not seemed prudent to re-introduce that, but we hope to do so in the not-toodistant future.

Reflecting on this, we can remind ourselves that Jesus is fully present in Holy Communion, whether received under the form of bread, the form of wine, or under both kinds. As many of you know, there is a lady (Sandra) at St George's who, through disability, is unable to receive under the form of bread, and receives under the form of wine only.

Perhaps I should explain the phrase "under the form". The great theologian St Thomas Aquinas, spoke about *form* as outward appearance and *substance* as what something really is. In the Eucharist the elements retain their form, their outward appearance. But what they are changes; they become the Body and Blood of Christ. It is from that idea of the change of substance that we get the term, *Transubstantiation*. Note that strictly speaking the bread does not just become the Body of Christ, and the wine does not become only the Blood of Christ, even if we sometimes use that terminology. As I said above, both become the real presence of the whole Christ 'body blood, soul and divinity' as many of you were taught!

So, in receiving Communion, we are receiving Christ. That life of Christ is given to us, not just for ourselves, but also for the benefit of the Church and the World. For the term 'Body of Christ' has another meaning. It is the Church. As St Augustine says, we receive the Body of Christ in order to become the Body of Christ. Through Communion with Jesus we also receive the mission of Jesus, to be his presence in the world. And we do that precisely as a Communion, as the Church, as the Body of Christ!
