Mass Changes

There are to be some changes to Masses in the area in the coming year. The principle change for us is the amalgamation of the Saturday evening Masses at St Theresa's and St Peter's. From next weekend there will be no 5:30 Saturday Mass at St Theresa's, and Fr Tony will be celebrating the 6pm vigil Mass at St Peter's, Hove. Confessions will be 5:15 — 5:45 at St Peter's. Also, the Sunday morning Polish Mass will be at 9:30am at St Mary Magdalene's in Brighton and not at St George's. The Sunday morning Mass in English at St Mary Magdalen's is moving to 11am. These changes are partly a consequence of the falling number of clergy. But they also represent a certain 'consolidation' of smaller congregations so the Masses are better supported. There will be further changes 'down the road' for the whole deanery as the Bishop's pastoral plan, (see right), the fruit of several years of consultation and reflection, reshapes the way we develop the mission of the Church in our parishes, deaneries, and diocese.

31st December 2023: The Holy Family Weekdays: Season of Christmas

Fr Tony Writes:

Happy Christmas! Last weekend we were still in Advent, so this is the first newsletter of Christmas. It is also good to remind ourselves that we are still in Christmastide (which ends next Monday, 8th January, with the Baptism of the Lord).

This weekend we celebrate the Holy Family. The Gospel reading this year (Year B) is the story of the Presentation, in which Simeon speaks of his joy at seeing the Saviour, but also the sorrow that is coming for Mary: "A sword shall pierce your heart".

Indeed the feast of the Holy Family always has this 'double edged' nature. Last year (Year A) we heard of the flight into Egypt, and next year (Year C) we have the finding in the temple. This reminds us that the Holy Family is more than the rather serene scenes we see on our Christmas cards and in our cribs.

That even the Holy Family struggled and suffered at times should give us hope and consolation when we struggle in our own families, whether because of external causes or simply because of the changing realities growing children bring.

The difficulties faced by the Holy Family should also give us compassion for families who want to escape crippling poverty or are fleeing violence or oppression. Sadly, the political rhetoric around migration increasingly demonises those who simply desire a secure and peaceful life for their families. It also seems to forget the huge contribution migrants have made to our society over the decades.

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, watch over us and our families. Help us to grow in love and understanding of one another. Amen.

Note changes of dates (owing to the Bishop's webinar being on 10th Jan)

A series of talks on the Gospel of Mark

Wednesday, 17th & 24th January, & 7th February, St Theresa's, 7:45pm. (Mass 7pm, followed by refreshments.)

This year on Sundays we will be hearing the Gospel of Mark. It is the shortest and most dynamic of Gospels. It was probably written in Rome, for a small Church community that had known St Peter, and was now enduring persecution and seeing people falling away.

What was it like to hear the Gospel for the first time, possibly hidden secretly in a room in the city? The first session on the 17th January, will be a 'read through' of the whole Gospel, after a brief 'scene setting' to try to 'capture' its atmosphere. Then on the 24th January and the 7th February we will look more closely at key features and themes of Mark's story of Jesus.
