Canon David Writes...

As we celebrate Pentecost praying for the Holy Spirit to renew us, we hear that we are sent, once again, as heralds of the Gospel. In the Gospel of the day Jesus shares with the disciples his peace and then says: "As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." He bestows upon them the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins which anticipates the powerful outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles at Pentecost. This reminds not only of the healing given in the sacrament of Reconciliation but the healing which also comes to us when we forgive each other our transgressions, from our hearts.

We receive the Holy Spirit in the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, and He sustains us in our lives of faith. The Catholic charismatic movement though, which started to gather pace in the 1960's and 1970's and continues to this day, had a great insight for Catholics everywhere. It was based on this question; have the gifts brought to us by the Holy Spirit at our Baptism and Confirmation been fanned into a bright flame of faith able to warm and enlighten others by its glow? Perhaps those involved in the movement might phrase it slightly differently, but as we hear about the tongues of fire resting on the Apostles, we get the general idea. Today we ask the Holy Spirit for the flame of faith to be burning brightly in our hearts.



Corpus Christi at Arundel Cathedral

For over 140 years, Arundel Cathedral has celebrated the Feast of Corpus Christi with a magnificent Festival of Flowers, featuring the world-famous Carpet of Flowers in the central aisle of the Cathedral and a procession of the Blessed Sacrament from the Cathedral to the courtyard of Arundel Castle, where Benediction is given.

The dates for Corpus Christi 2026 are Wednesday 3rd and Thursday 4th June. The Cathedral will be open while the carpet is laid on Tuesday 2nd June, closing when the carpet is complete. Visitors may view the carpet on Wednesday from 9:30am–7.00pm and Thursday from 9:30am–5:30pm, when Mass begins.

Entry is free and booking is not required, although donations are welcomed to support the event. Hot and cold food and drinks will be available at the Cathedral Centre from 9am on both days.

Profession of Faith
