Canon David writes...

Following the celebration for St Philip Howard a couple weeks ago, it is all change again for the next couple of Sunday's.

This week we will celebrate All Saints Day and the following week the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. If you are a reader at Mass or a musician watch out for the changes to the readings and prayers.

November is a month when we remember the deceased, especially family and friends but also others like colleagues and clergy and the fallen in war. But this month of remembrance begins with the celebration of All Saints. No doubt our churches will ring out with that familiar hymn 'For all the saints'. Well, it wouldn't be the start of November without it!

To be a Saint is at the heart of our Diocesan Pastoral Plan. On this day it is worth revisiting what Bishop Richard wrote back in 2023 in 'The Word who is Life: The Pastoral Plan: The Call to Mission.' He wrote "I therefore take this opportunity to invite everyone in the Diocese – lay faithful and religious, deacons and priests – to join with me in forging our parishes into communities of saints..." How do we go about this? The good news is that the Holy Spirit is working on this already since our baptism and we also help one another. The work we will do together as one parish of Brighton and Hove will further help us as we share our gifts and resources in serving the mission of the Church to help all become saints.

In that Pastoral Plan, Bishop Richard asks that "...we be more closely conformed to Christ, that as His disciples we may bring the Good News to our brothers and sisters, both near and far."
