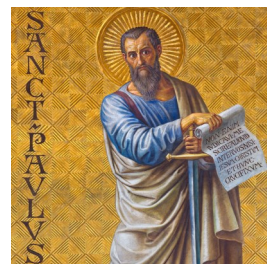

Fr. Tony Writes



At last I have a phone at my new house!
 My phone number is quite easy to remember:
 01273 313111. Please use this number if you
 need to speak to me personally. For general parish
 administrative stuff please continue to use the parish
 number, and for hall business of course call Sandra.

Communication is, of course, one of the key tasks of the church. We are called to proclaim the Gospel, and that is an act of communication. St Paul, who we celebrate along with St Peter this week, was one of the Church's greatest communicators. Around 40% of the New Testament is connected with Paul in some way. 13 letters bear his name. A fourteenth, the Letter to the Hebrews, is at times attributed to him, and although that is unlikely, the influence of Paul's thought can be seen in it. Paul is the main human character of the Acts of the Apostles (The main character is the Holy Spirit!), and as Luke, who wrote that book, appears to have been Paul's companion on some of his journeys, we could see Luke's Gospel as another writing that owes something to Paul. The Second Letter of Peter mentions the letters of Paul, and the Letter of James was partly written as a response to a wrong interpretation of Paul.



As we switch back into Ordinary Time, the way the readings at Mass are chosen changes. In the seasons (Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter) and on feast days (such as Corpus Christi) generally all three readings (and the psalm) link together. For the rest of the year the First Reading is linked to the Gospel, and the Psalm is linked to the First reading. But the Second Reading—which is usually from one of Paul's letters—follows its own pattern, working through the letters systematically over the three year cycle. As we 'drop back' into Ordinary Time we find ourselves towards the end of Paul's Letter to the Galatians.

Often at Mass the priest focusses his homily on the Gospel, but as I have taught St Paul on and off for many years I quite often start from the second reading. I will be doing that this weekend, though I will be linking it to the Gospel (which is quite easy to do this week!).

Thanks to all who came to the meeting about the SVP on Wednesday. The good turnout means we should be able to do a bit of a relaunch. The SVP is a very useful resource for a parish, as it gives a tried and tested structure to support the poor, lonely and vulnerable in our community.
