Fr Tony Writes:

Rejoice in the Lord always and again I say rejoice! (x2)
Rejoice, rejoice, and again I say rejoice! (x2)

We will be singing this as a round this weekend. It comes from today's entrance antiphon, which in turn comes from St Paul's letter to the Philippians (4:4).

This Third Sunday of Advent is called 'Gaudete Sunday' for that reason: 'Gaudete' is just Latin for 'Rejoice'. This may remind you of Steely Span's popularisation of an old Latin Carol: Gaudete gaudete, Christus est natus ex Maria virgine, gaudete. (Rejoice, Christ is born of the Virgin Mary). Yet we are over a week away from celebrating that, so why are we rejoicing this weekend? Gaudete reminds us of an important aspect of our faith, and one that is particularly emphasised in Advent: the virtue of hope. Of course we do not have to hope for the birth of Christ as we know that has already happened. But we do hope for the completion of the salvation that begins with the coming of Christ. And because that hope is not like our ordinary hopes, ('I hope it will snow at Christmas'; 'I hope Brighton get a top four place'), but rather is assured by God's promises, even if we do not see it yet, then we can rejoice now, amid the many problems and difficulties we face as individuals and as a society.

Rejoice in the Lord always!

A short series of talks by Fr Tony on the Gospel of Mark

Wednesday 10th, 17th & 24th January, St Theresa's, 7:45pm. (Mass at 7pm, followed by refreshments.)

This year on Sundays we will be hearing the Gospel of Mark. It is the shortest and most dynamic of Gospels. It was probably written in Rome, for a small Church community that had known St Peter, and was now enduring persecution and seeing people falling away.

What was it like to hear the Gospel for the first time, possibly hidden secretly in a room in the city? The first session on the 10th January, will be a 'read through' of the whole Gospel, after a brief 'scene setting' to try to 'capture' its atmosphere. Then on the 17th and the 24th we will look more closely at key features and themes of Mark's story of Jesus.

'Midnight' Mass will be available at St Peter's, Portland Road, and the Sacred Heart, Norton Road.

Crib Offering 2023

To support the Catholic Children's Society A&B Crisis Fund

The Catholic Children's Society (CCS) is helping local families in crisis who are struggling to put food on the table, keep warm and provide a safe home for their children. Recently CCS helped a mother and her two young sons who were evicted from their home when the landlord sold the property. They were moved into Local Authority housing, but the flat was completely empty, cold and drafty. Their previous home was furnished, and they had no money to buy even a bed. The mother and children slept on her coat on the bare floor. Both children had asthma and their health quickly deteriorated in the cold flat. CCS provided a grant to help them buy beds, warm fleece bedding, thick duvets, and rugs, to keep the family warm through winter. The mother said:

"I cannot believe the difference this has made! I can tuck my children into their very own beds at night and keep them warn and cosy. Thank you for caring about us."

There are many more vulnerable families in need of support and our parish will be donating our Crib Offering to support this important work. Every penny donated will be given out via CCS's A&B Crisis Fund to support local families in need.
