21st January 2024: 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Weekdays: 3rd Week in Ordinary Time, Year II

Fr Tony Writes:

This Sunday is the Third Sunday of the Year, which is designated the Sunday of the Word of God. We return to the reading of Mark's Gospel after last week hearing from John. The story picks up just after the Baptism of Jesus. We hear of the beginning of Jesus ministry and the calling of the first four disciples. And in the coming weeks we will hear how that early ministry develops.

One particular feature of this first chapter of Mark is the pace with which Jesus' ministry grows and expands. This is underlined by the language Mark uses. The word 'immediately' occurs eleven times in the narrative,* though in our versions we get a variety of synonyms for the single Greek word (euthus) that Mark uses.

In the Baptism story, the Holy Spirit descended 'immediately' as Jesus rises from the water. And then he was driven 'immediately' into the wilderness.

In today's story, Simon Peter and Andrew respond to Jesus' call by 'immediately' leaving their nets and following him, then Jesus sees James and John and 'immediately' calls them also.

Mind you, rapid initial response is not necessarily a sign things will last. We know the disciples run away when Jesus is arrested, and Peter denies Jesus. This will be underlined in the parable of the sower in chapter 4, when Jesus speaks of the seed that springs up rapidly, but has no roots, and withers in the heat.

But for now let us marvel at the alacrity with which those four disciples leapt up to follow Jesus, knowing that, despite their failures, which Mark will narrate quite pointedly later, they are still part of the group of Apostles through whom we, too, came to hear the Good News!

*Verses 10,12, 18, 20, 21, 23, 28, 29, 30, 42 & 43.

And here is a challenge for anyone with a copy of the Catholic Children's Bible: find the various words or phrases in those verses that mean 'immediately' (verse 21 is hard!).

A series of talks on the Gospel of Mark

Wednesdays, 24th Jan & 7th Feb, St Theresa's, 7:45pm. (Mass 7pm, followed by refreshments.)

This year on Sundays we will be hearing the Gospel of Mark. It is the shortest and most dynamic of Gospels. It was probably written in Rome, for a small Church community that had known St Peter, and was now enduring persecution and seeing people falling away.

What was it like to hear the Gospel for the first time, possibly hidden secretly in a room in the city? Having listened to the whole Gospel last week, this Wednesday we will look at some of the key themes of the first half of the Gospel, which all happens at a rather breathless pace. We will look at the second half of the Gospel on the 7th February.
