10th March 2024: 4th Sunday of Lent, Year B: 'Laetare' Sunday. Weekdays: Lent Week 4

Fr Tony Writes:

Rejoice! That is the first word of the entrance antiphon today, in Latin Laetare, which gives this Sunday its name. It is also Mothering Sunday (or Mother's Day). There are a number of reasons for this link. The Entrance antiphon goes on to portray Jerusalem as a mother, and, perhaps linked to this, it was a day when people, especially those in 'service', returned to their 'mother church', the place of their baptism, and in doing so would also visit their own mothers, who likely still lived in the same parish.

This theme of return is found in our readings today. The people of Israel were exiled from their homeland under the Babylonians, but got to return to their own land after the Persians conquered the Babylonians.

Sometimes people wonder where all the young people are in church. What can we do to bring them back? Well, my experience suggests we simply wait and be open. Many who drift away as teenagers or young adults, once they start a family of their own, want their children to be part of the Church, and so return to it themselves. If you are one of those, you are very welcome. Indeed, our welcoming of families is key to the future of our Church!

So Happy Mother's Day! Rejoice! I hope you all feel very welcome and at home in 'Mother' Church!

Last week I spoke of the parish finances...

I pointed out that last year our spending was £20K more than our income. One parishioner pointed out that this information is not helpful on its own. What does it mean for us? Well, with something like 100 active households in the parish, each giving weekly, then that works out at an average increase in giving of £4 per household per week. That is not a huge amount, around the price of a coffee and less than a pint of beer. Nonetheless, some of you may find that too much. Then again, others may be able to afford to increase by a bit more than that. Maybe some of you don't give regularly at present and would like to do so.

For further context, essential work on the electrics at both churches, and repair work on the heating and car park at St Theresa's, is going to cost us about 15K in the coming weeks!

We don't get any funding other than that which we generate ourselves, so please be generous if you can. Details of ways to give can be found on the facing page.
