Fr Tony Writes

May the joy of the Resurrection enlighten your minds and hearts!

Today we celebrate the central truth of our faith: Jesus raised from the dead! A truth the male disciples could not believe when told about it by the women, and could barely believe when they saw it for themselves. A truth which, in the developed world, is also increasingly disbelieved. Perhaps even we struggle to believe it sometimes. Yet how else do you explain the transformation of the disciples, and their willingness to face death for insisting on this truth?

As a truth it is an interesting, indeed astonishing, fact. But its meaning is perhaps even more astonishing. For it shows us that sin, evil, hatred and violence are not overcome by power and might in the human sense, but in weakness, faithfulness and service. That was the message Jesus proclaimed in his life. It was the message he embodied in his death. And it is a message which is gloriously affirmed in his Resurrection, and indeed the events of the subsequent generations.

For the Church expanded rapidly in the first three centuries, despite being frequently persecuted and having no political might.

So even if the Church in our developed world seems to

increasingly marginalised and ridiculed, we should not be afraid. But we must continue to proclaim this central truth!
